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45	ARTICLE II: MEMBERSHIP
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47	Section 1. <u>Types of membership</u> . This association shall include five types of
48	membership Regular, Retired, Student, Associate, and Honorary.
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50	Section 2. Qualifications for membership . Membership in ACA and an interest in
51	and desire to uphold the purposes and principles of AMCD shall be a condition of
52	membership in AMCD. All members in good standing, except as limited below, are
53	entitled to all the privileges of individual membership. The categories of membership
54	shall be determined in accordance with the following:
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56	a. Regular members. Regular members are those who meet the following
57	requirements:
58	1) Full or part-time employment in counseling, mental health and
59	development work (as defined below) at the time of applying for
60	regular membership.
61	2) Experience in counseling and development, which may include:
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63	i. Placement, training and other aspects of counseling and
64	development work in communities, educational settings,
65	business and industry, government agencies, and other
66	organizations.
67	ii. Test development, multicultural assessment, occupational and
68	other research and writing directly related to counseling and
69	development.
70	iii. International and US tribal honored indigenous healing or
71	spiritual advising,
72	iv. Counselor training and education, and
73	v. Administration of programs of the above types.
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75	b. Retired members. Retired members are those who meet the
76	qualifications for Regular membership and have retired from full time
77	employment.
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79	c. Student members. A student engaged in full or part-time study in an
80	accredited undergraduate or graduate school or international and/or
81	tribal honored indigenous healer or spiritual advisor program of study
82	related to counseling may be admitted as a student member upon
83	application and proof of student status.

d. **Associate members**. Individuals who are interested in counseling 85 related work but who do not meet the requirements of one of the above 86 87 categories. 88 e. Honorary members. Persons who have made an outstanding 89 contribution in the area of multicultural counseling and development 90 may be admitted to honorary membership at the discretion of the 91 AMCD Executive Council. Honorary members are exempt from paying 92 dues. They shall have all the privileges of membership except they shall 93 not be eligible for any elected AMCD office and except for the President 94 Emeritus shall not have voting privileges. 95 96 f. Members of each ethnic groups shall self select into each by declaring 97 98 their ethnicity on the ACA membership application or by notifying the ethnic Vice-President(s) of their desire to identify with said interest 99 group(s). 100 101 g. Members of the various Regions shall be part of the region within 102 which they hold primary residence. 103 104 Section 3. Application for membership. Persons desiring to become members of 105 AMCD shall make application to the ACA specifying AMCD as a division of 106 choice. ACA shall notify applicants of the action taken on their applications and the 107 AMCD Membership Chair shall send a welcome notice on behalf of the association to 108 each member accepted for membership. Persons shall become AMCD members upon 109 their election to membership and the payment of their dues. 110 111 112 Section 4. Continuity of membership. Membership in AMCD shall be continuous. renewable annually with the payment of dues. 113 114 Section 5. Rights and privileges. All members (except honorary) in good standing 115 shall be eligible to vote, and to hold office in the Association if they meet the 116 qualifications specified for each elected office. The President Emeritus shall retain 117 voting rights. 118 119 Section 6. Termination of Membership. 120 121 a. Membership may be cancelled for any conduct that adversely affects 122 AMCD, its reputation, or that violates the ACA Code of Ethics or AMCD 123 By-Laws. Procedures for such removal will be dictated by the AMCD 124 Procedures Manual, which will be drafted by the Ethics Committee, 125 approved by the Executive Council, reviewed annually by the Ethics 126

The Annual meeting of the Association shall be held at the place and 180 during the time of the annual convention of ACA. The time and place 181 of this meeting shall be announced to the membership in all available 182 media (Counseling Today, AMCD Newsletter, the AMCD website, 183 email, etc.) at least 90 days in advance. 184 185 b. The Executive Council shall hold its annual meeting at the time and 186 place of the annual convention of ACA, meet at least quarterly to 187 include during early July to approve the annual budget and committee 188 appointments, and at such other times as may be designated by either 189 the president or a majority of the Executive Council. 190 191 c. A majority of the members of the Executive Council shall constitute a 192 quorum. The members may be present in a mixed format; i.e. in person, 193 on the telephone, on an electronic system or by a designated proxy 194 representative as long as the Council approves and everyone present can 195 hear or read discussions, participate in discussions, and have an 196 opportunity to vote on proposed actions to be taken. 197 198 ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS, AMCD REPRESENTATIVE(S) TO ACA 199 GOVERNING COUNCIL, REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVES 200 201 Section 1. Officers 202 203 a. The officers of the Association shall be the President, President-Elect, 204 Immediate Past-President, Vice-Presidents (see Section 4d), Secretary, 205 Treasurer, President-Emeritus and Parliamentarian. 206 207 b. Only officers elected to the Executive Council shall have voting 208

privileges on the Executive Council.

210 211 Section 2. Method of Selection – Officers and Executive Council Members 212 a. The President-Elect shall be elected in accordance with Article V and 213 procedures established by the Nominations and Elections Committee 214 and approved by the Executive Council.. 215 216 b. The Secretary and Parliamentarian shall be nominated by the President 217 and appointed by the Executive Council. They may be re-nominated 218 219 and re-appointed. 220 c. The Treasurer shall be nominated by the President-Elect and appointed 221 by the Executive Council as Treasurer-in-Training/Treasurer- Elect to 222 serve as Treasurer during the year of presidency. The Treasurer may be 223 re-nominated and re-appointed. 224 225 d. Vice-Presidents shall IAW Article V, be selected in a manner 226 established by their respective ethnic groups, except that candidates 227 must be regular or retired members of AMCD. 228 229 e. The AMCD Representative(s) to ACA Governing Council shall be 230 elected by the AMCD membership in accordance with Article V, ACA 231 requirements, and procedures established by the Nominations and 232 Elections Committee and approved by the Executive Council. Nominees 233 shall have previously been elected officers, and shall be regular or 234 retired members in good standing of AMCD. 235 236 237 f. One Regional Representative shall be elected by each AMCD region IAW Article V and procedures proposed by the Nominations and 238 Elections Committee and approved by the Executive Council. 239 240 g. The Student representative to the Executive Council shall be elected 241 annually by the student members of the association during the annual 242 ACA Convention IAW Article V using procedures developed by the 243 student members or the Nominations and Elections Committee and 244 approved by the Executive Council. 245 246 h. The President Emeritus shall be granted a lifetime appointment by the 247 Executive Council subject to a majority confirmation vote at the general 248 business meeting at the national convention. There shall be only one 249 President Emeritus at a time, except that upon his/her death or 250 resignation another may be appointed. 251

Section 3. Terms of Office for Officers and Executive Council Members

- a. The President-Elect, elected annually, shall hold office for one year, and shall succeed to the Presidency for a one-year term, and then to the immediate past-presidency for a one-year term. The President shall be ineligible to serve again as President-Elect or President for a period of five years following previous service in either office.
- b. The Secretary, Treasurer, and Parliamentarian shall serve a one-year appointment, but may be reappointed.
- c. Regional Representatives and Vice-Presidents shall be elected for a term of three years, and the terms shall be staggered for each group so no more than two are elected in the same year.
- d. The AMCD Representative(s) to the ACA Governing Council shall be elected for a three-year term.
- e. The President Emeritus shall hold office for life or until s/he resigns.
- f. The student representative shall serve a one-year term, but may be reelected.
- g. In the event of resignation, continued absence, illness, removal from office, or death of any officer, Executive Council Member or Committee Chair other than the President, President-Elect or Vice-Presidents the Executive Council shall, by majority vote, elect a successor to serve until the next annual election or appointment process.
- h. If any Vice-President is unable to finish a term for which s/he was elected, the Ethnic Interest Group the individual represents shall within 90 days select a replacement by a predetermined process of their choice, to serve until the next regular election, and notify the Council of this person's name, address, phone number and email. In the event the Ethnic Group is unable or fails to elect or appoint a replacement within 90 days, one may be appointed by the Executive Council to serve until a new election can be held.
- i. If the President is unable to serve out the term for which s/he was elected the President-Elect shall retain the duties of the President-Elect and assume the duties of the President, continuing in this position through the

year for which s/he was elected to serve, and if necessary may, with the approval of the Executive Council, appoint an assistant to help with the duties of the President-Elect.

j. In the event that the President-Elect is unable to serve out his/her term of President-Elect the person with the next highest number of votes in the election shall assume the duties of the President-Elect and go on to serve as President and Past-President. In the event that there were no other candidates or this President-Elect is unable to assume the duties of President, the Executive Council may, by majority vote, choose a Vice-President to serve as Interim President-Elect and President until the next annual election.

k. Nominations for positions elected by the full AMCD Membership or by members of a specific region shall be made to the AMCD Nominations and Elections Committee in accordance with Executive Council approved procedures. Positions that will be elected using the ACA annual elections process shall follow ACA established requirements and timelines.

1. Nominations for positions elected by the various ethnic groups shall be determined by the membership of the respective ethnic groups. They may be made to the AMCD Nominations and Elections Committee in accordance with Executive Council approved procedures or elections may be held according to their internally established procedures. All election procedures shall be published in the first AMCD Newsletter each year. Positions that will be elected using the ACA annual elections process shall follow ACA established requirements and timelines.

m. The term of office of each elected or appointed official of AMCD shall coincide with the ACA terms of office and continue for the period specified or until the successor takes office, except for the office of President Emeritus.

Section 4. Functions of Officers and Executive Council Members

a. **The President**. The President shall:

(1) be a regular or retired member of AMCD.

(2) exert leadership in the achievement of the purposes of AMCD.

(3) preside at meetings of the Executive Council and the Executive Committee.

 (4) While serving as President-Elect nominate for Council approval chairpersons of all AMCD committees to serve concurrent with

Nomination and election procedures for all elected positions shall be 505 publicized annually in the Newsletter and on the Website, clearly spell 506 out all criteria necessary to be eligible for nomination to each position, 507 and promote leadership training so that all members shall have access to 508 nomination. 509 510 ARTICLE VI: STATE DIVISIONS CHARTERS 511 512 Section 1. Formation of State Divisions. 513 514 515 a. A minimum of seven (7) members of AMCD residing within a state, territory, or the District of Columbia may organize a state division of AMCD 516 and apply for a charter. 517 518 b. A set of By-Laws congruent with the AMCD By-Laws (subject to review of 519 the AMCD By-Laws Committee and approval of the AMCD Executive 520 Council), a list of officers, and a membership list shall accompany the 521 522
 - application of a charter.

 c. A state division may adopt its own name, but in all instances shall identify

itself as "A State Division of the Association for Multicultural Counseling

- d. Only one state division may be chartered in any state.
- e. Application for a state division shall be made to the Chairperson of the State Divisions Committee of AMCD, to be submitted to the Executive Council for consideration and action. The President-Elect of AMCD shall chair the State Divisions Committee.
- f. Applications shall be submitted to the Chairperson by January 31 prior to the ACA National Convention.
- g. The official presentation of a state division charter shall be made at the Annual ACA Convention.

Section 2. Membership

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a. Any member who qualifies for AMCD membership shall be eligible for 542 membership in a state division. 543 544 b. All officers of a state division shall be Regular or Retired regular members of 545 AMCD. 546 547 Section 3. Autonomy of State Divisions. A State division of AMCD shall 548 549 a. be autonomous in the conduct of its affairs consistent with these By-Laws 550 551 and the laws and regulations of the respective State, District or Territory. 552 553 c. have the power to choose its own officers and representatives to the executive body of the state branch of ACA except in all instances the officers 554 and representatives shall be regular or retired voting members in good 555 standing of AMCD. 556 557 b. A state division shall levy and collect its own fees and shall have full control 558 of the management and disbursement of such funds in carrying out its 559 program(s). 560 561 c. Any proposed changes in the By-Laws of a state division shall be reviewed 562 by the AMCD By-Laws Committee and approved by the Executive Council 563 of AMCD before becoming effective 564 565 Section 4. **Reports Required**. Each state division shall transmit at the times and in 566 the manner specified by the Executive Council, a report of its activities, 567 568 the names of its officers, committee chairpersons, and members in the state division (with type of AMCD membership specified for each 569 570 member.) 571 572 Section 5. **Revocation of Charter**. 573 574 a. The Executive Council shall consider all charges submitted in writing and made over the signature of an AMCD member in good standing which 575 suggest that a state division is no longer observing the conditions under 576 which its charter was initially granted, nor is it within the policies and 577 ByLaws of AMCD. 578 579

b. A State division so charged shall be given the opportunity to present

evidence in its behalf through witnesses or otherwise, shall be given the

opportunity to confront witnesses against the state division, and shall be offered an opportunity to appear at a hearing before the Executive Council.

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584 585 c. A state division may request dissolution by filing notice of intent to dissolve with the Executive Council. 586 587 d. Before final action may be taken with respect to the dissolution of a state 588 division, a notice of intent to dissolve shall first be passed by a two-thirds 589 vote of the Executive Council members present and voting, and the state 590 division in question advised, in writing, for the reasons for the proposed 591 action, at least 180 days before such a recommendation is finally acted on 592 by the Executive Council. 593 594 e. A two-thirds vote of the Executive Council is required for the revocation of 595 a state division charter. 596 597 f. Decisions made by the Executive Council in matters relating to the 598 revocation of state division charters shall be final. 599 600 ARTICLE VII: COMMITTEES AND COMMISSIONS 601 602 Section 1. **Executive Committee**. This committee shall: 603 604 a. consist of the President, the President-Elect, the immediate Past-President, 605 and the Chairs (or representatives) of the Vice-Presidents and the Regional 606 Representatives Councils. 607 608 b. act for the Executive Council in the interim between meetings to carry out 609 emergency measures related to the policies, procedures and activities 610 approved by the council, but shall 611 612 c. bring all policy matters and new business before the full council for 613 approval at its next meeting. 614 615 d. report all business transactions to the Executive Council within 15 days of 616 said transaction. 617 618 Section 2. **Standing Committees**. The standing committees of AMCD shall establish 619 budgets, operating activities, procedures and practices approved by the Executive 620 Council. Their duties shall include: 621 622 a. Except as otherwise specified in these By-Laws, chairpersons and 799 members of committees shall serve for one year or until the 800 appointment of their successors. They may be reappointed consistent 801 with these By-Laws. 802 803 **ARTICLE VIII: FINANCES** 804 805 806 Section 1. **Dues and Assessments**. The following procedures shall be followed in establishing AMCD dues and assessments, in addition to those required 807 by the By-Laws of ACA. 808 809 a. Annual dues for all classes of membership shall be established by the 810 Executive Council. 811 812 b. The Executive Council may levy special assessments on the entire 813 membership or on any class of members with a special member ballot 814 and approval of 2/3 majority of voting members. 815 816 Section 2. Salaried Employees. The Executive Council may authorize the 817 employment of such staff as may be necessary to fulfill the objectives of 818 AMCD and set compensation for such employees. 819 820 ARTICLE IX: BUSINESS AFFAIRS OF THE ASSOCIATION 821 822 Section 1. **Fiscal year**. The fiscal year shall run concurrently with that of ACA. 823 Section 2. Severable or Transferable Interest. No member, individually or 824 collectively, shall have any severable or transferable interest in the 825 property of the Association. 826 827 828 Section 3. Control and Management of Property. All property shall be subject to the management and control of the Executive Council and no real property 829 shall be disposed of except pursuant to the prior written approval of the 830 Executive Council. 831 832

Section 4. **Basic Documents**. The basic governance documents of the Association

and all amendments thereto shall be transmitted to the Executive Director 834 of ACA within thirty days of their adoption, printed annually in the 835 member Newsletter and posted on the AMCD Website. 836 837 Section 5. Fidelity Bonds. The Executive Council shall secure and maintain in force 838 a fidelity bond adequate in amount to protect the Association against 839 defalcations by designated officers or employees. 840 841 Section 6. Annual Audit. The Executive Council shall make sure that all financial 842 records are available for an annual audit which is conducted by a certified 843 public accountant secured by ACA. A full report shall be submitted to the 844 Executive Council within 10 days of receipt of the audit results by AMCD 845 846 Section 7. **Property of AMCD**. In the event the Association should be dissolved, 847 none of its property shall be distributed to any of the members. All of its 848 property shall be transferred according to ACA By-Laws. 849 850 **ARTICLE X: PUBLICATIONS** 851 852 Section 1. Association Publications. The Journal of Multicultural Counseling and 853 Development and the AMCD Newsletter shall be designated as official 854 publications of AMCD. 855 856 Section 2. **Distribution**. The *Journal of Multicultural Counseling and Development* 857 and the AMCD Newsletter shall be sent by postal or electronic means to 858 all AMCD members without additional charge. They shall be available to 859 non-members, to libraries, and to other organizations by subscription at 860 rates established by the AMCD Executive Council and distributed by 861 ACA. Publications may be posted on the AMCD website with Executive 862 Council approval. 863 864 Section 3. AMCD Newsletter. 865 a. The newsletter shall be published quarterly during July, October, January 866 and April, and may be published as often during the year as necessary to 867 ensure members are kept informed of association business, pending 868 elections, convention plans and schedules, committee appointment 869 opportunities, election results, etc. 870 871 b. The Newsletter editor shall be appointed by the Executive Council for a 872

period of (2) two years. Nominations may come from the members of the

Executive Council, or the Media Committee.

915	c. The Editor-Elect . The Editor-Elect shall	

(1) be appointed by the Executive Council one year prior to the 916 expiration of the term of the Editor. 917 (2) The Council shall give due consideration to recommendations of 918 the Editorial Board in making the appointment, but is not restricted 919 by such recommendations. 920 (3) The Editor-Elect shall assist the Editor in performing the duties of 921 the Editor, in preparation for assuming those duties. 922 923 ARTICLE XI: ADOPTION, REVISION AND AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS 924 925 Section 1. Amendment, Revision, and Adoption. These By-Laws may be amended 926 or revised by two-thirds majority vote of the Executive Council or majority vote of the 927 full membership after submission of the proposed amendment by either of the two 928 929 following methods. 930 a. An amendment or revision shall be presented to the Executive Council 931 not less than 120 days prior to the annual meeting of the Executive 932 Council by the By-Laws Committee. Amendments/ revisions proposed 933 in this manner 934 (1) may be proposed in writing by the committee members and/or to 935 the By-Laws Committee by the Executive Council, and/or 936 (2) over the signature of 50 members in good standing. 937 (3) The committee will compile all recommendations, drawing up a 938 set of recommended changes/revisions to be accepted by the council 939 under the above timeline for review by the full membership. 940 941 942 Copies of amendments or revisions proposed under the provision of the 943 foregoing paragraph shall be mailed to members for review not less than 90 days prior to the annual meeting in preparation for a final review and 944 945 vote by the Executive Council at their annual meeting. Current By-Laws will accompany the distribution of proposed amendments/revisions and all 946 members will be encouraged to submit feedback and a non-binding vote 947 to the By-Laws Committee Chair. The By-Laws Committee will draw up 948 a final set of recommended changes and submit them to the Executive 949 Council no later than 30 days prior to the annual meeting of the Executive 950 Council held during the annual ACA Convention. 951 952 The Executive Council will approve and enact amendments or revisions to 953 the By-Laws at their annual meeting, notify the membership of the 954 changes during the annual membership meeting, notify the ACA President 955

and/or other ACA leaders as prescribed in the ACA By-Laws, publicize

the changes on the website, in the Newsletter and in the Journal within 90 957 days of their final adoption. 958 959 b. An amendment or revision first proposed at any meeting of the 960 Executive Council shall be voted upon by postal or electronic ballot of 961 the full council after 60 days following the date of proposal, provided, 962 however, that such proposal 963 (1) has been sent to the membership for input with a non-binding 964 ballot/feedback form members can send to the By-Laws Committee 965 Chair within 20 days. 966 (2) the proposal shall be referred forthwith to the By-Laws Committee 967 and this committee's written recommendation shall accompany the 968 final proposal submitted to the Executive Council for vote. 969 970 (3) The Executive Council will adopt the amendment/revision with a 2/3-majority vote of the council, or by submitting it to the members for 971 972 a vote. 973 c. An amendment or revision proposed by one of the two above means 974 can be submitted to the full membership for vote and will be adopted if 975 at least 25% of the membership votes, and if a majority of the voting 976 members approve it. If less than 25% of the membership votes, and a 977 majority of the voting members approve it, the Amendment shall be 978 adopted if a majority of the Executive Council approves it. 979 980 Section 2. Publication. The By-Laws of AMCD shall be published in their 981 entirety, no less than every five years, beginning with the year 1975 in 982 addition to the requirements for publication of amendments/revisions 983 noted in Section 1 above.. They shall be published in the official journal, 984 the Newsletter, on the AMCD website and by other available means. 985 986 ARTICLE XII: RULES OF ORDER 987 988 989 Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, shall govern all proceedings of the Association where they are not inconsistent with these By-Laws. 990 991 992 The End
